School uniform

Getting ready for September, just a reminder that school uniform should be named and consists of:

- Grey trousers, shorts, skirts or pinafores
- Yellow polo shirt
- Ravensfield cardigan, jumper – the fleece is optional
- Black footwear
- Grey socks/tights
- Waterproof coat with hood (dark in colour)

PE kit should come into school in a named PE bag. This consists of:

- Black shorts
- White t-shirt
- Black pumps or trainers

Jewellery is not permitted. If ears are pierced studs should be worn but must be removed before PE. Watches are permitted but not ones with a recording option. We recommend analogue watches as this aids with an understanding of time and enhances a child's mathematical development.
