Parent Phonics Power



Reception parents are invited to come into school on Thursday 16th October to join in with their children's Read Write Inc lessons. This is the principle way we teach phonics and decoding. These sessions allow

parents to understand how we teach reading and how they can support their children in this important life skill.

But while phonics and decoding are important this is only part of the story; reading to your child before they start school instils in them a love of reading. Continuing to read with them as they move through school builds fluency and the skills children need to read to learn.

Online Safety and Wellbeing

There are lots of positives for being online. But for some children it can become overwhelming. Many things can impact our online wellbeing and you can take control of the choices made to reduce any

School meals

Remember, using our system makes it easy to book the meals you want for your child. There is a great range of choice including a hot meal each day. All dietary needs are catered for by our dedicated school catering team. Please speak to the main office if you have any questions.

Jewellery and Make-up

The only jewellery allowed in school is a watch (non-recording) and stud earrings if children have pierced ears. All jewellery must be removed for PE and swimming. For younger children we recommend that parents remove earrings before school. Make up, nail varnish, acrylic nails etc are not permitted. Children may bring lip balm to provide protection from dry lips.

Class Dojo

We use ClassDojo as our main communication tool for key messages and class information as well as celebrating



achievements specific to a child or class. It is a great way of sending messages to staff too. Please note that staff will only access these messages between 8am and 4pm. Therefore, if your child is not going to be in school please ring the school office on 0161 344 2905 or email:
